The Season of Ordinary Time

We have entered the Season of Ordinary Time. The season of Ordinary Time is the longest liturgical season, and it is divided into two parts. The first part of Ordinary Time begins in January, on the day after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continues to the Season of Lent. The second part begins on the day after Pentecost and continues to Advent, when the liturgical year begins again. The purpose of this season is to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts and callings discerned during the Easter Season and commissioned on the Day of Pentecost. The Season is named Ordinary because the Sundays are numbered and are named after the Latin word for numbers in a series, which is *ordinalis*. The normal liturgical colour for Ordinary Time—for those days when there is no special feast—is Green. May we celebrate this season with love and commitment. **Amen! Fr Alex**

Theme: Humility and Generosity. Today's readings inform us that humility and generosity are eternal life-giving values. Humility is totally generous and makes us undertake with invincible courage all our tasks that we are called to do. Our generous heart may be full of doubts about our own capacity to do anything.
