### **The Season of Ordinary Time**

We have entered the Season of Ordinary Time. The season of Ordinary Time is the longest liturgical season, and it is divided into two parts. The first part of Ordinary Time begins in January, on the day after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continues to the Season of Lent. The second part begins on the day after Pentecost and continues to Advent, when the liturgical year begins again. The purpose of this season is to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts and callings discerned during the Easter Season and commissioned on the Day of Pentecost. The Season is named Ordinary because the Sundays are numbered and are named after the Latin word for numbers in a series, which is *ordinalis*. The normal liturgical colour for Ordinary Time—for those days when there is no special feast—is Green. May we celebrate this season with love and commitment. **Amen! Fr Alex**

**Theme: Discipleship and Salvation.** All the readings are related. The first reading says that God wants us all to be saved. That is why, in the Psalm, we are reminded of our obligation to proclaim and spread the Good News of salvation by our lives. This is not an easy task, the second reading warns us, so is the Gospel, Jesus warns us against complacency and self-righteousness. Thus the struggle to gain entrance into heaven entails: (1). Forgoing personal cares and pleasures, (2). Self-discipline and accepting that which God brings to us, and (3) Following the Christian way by our love and life. We have to opt for and cooperate with God’s graces in order to enter the narrow gate of salvation. Fr Alex
