

The Season of Ordinary Time. We have entered the Season of Ordinary Time. The season of Ordinary Time is the longest liturgical season, and it is divided into two parts. The first part of Ordinary Time begins in January, on the day after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continues to the Season of Lent. The second part begins on the day after Pentecost and continues to Advent, when the liturgical year begins again. The purpose of this season is to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts and callings discerned during the Easter Season and commissioned on the Day of Pentecost. The Season is named Ordinary because the Sundays are numbered and are named after the Latin word for numbers in a series, which is *ordinalis*. The normal liturgical colour for Ordinary Time—for those days when there is no special feast—is Green. May we celebrate this season with love and commitment. **Amen! Fr Alex**

Theme: Stewardship. In God, the virtues of mercy and justice blend perfectly. Last Sunday's message was about God's ineffable mercy and compassion. Today's is about the stewardship that His justice requires of us. In His goodness, God has entrusted us with many resources; and He expects us to account for how we use them. God wants everyone to be saved, even the lovers of money (see Luke 16:14). But we cannot serve two Masters. By His grace, we should choose to be, as we sing in today's Psalm, "servants of the Lord."
