The Season of Ordinary Time. We have entered the Season of Ordinary Time. The season of Ordinary Time is the longest liturgical season, and it is divided into two parts. The first part of Ordinary Time begins in January, on the day after the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord and continues to the Season of Lent. The second part begins on the day after Pentecost and continues to Advent, when the liturgical year begins again. The purpose of this season is to support new disciples and the whole congregation in living out the gifts and callings discerned during the Easter Season and commissioned on the Day of Pentecost. The Season is named Ordinary because the Sundays are numbered and are named after the Latin word for numbers in a series, which is ordinalis. The normal liturgical colour for Ordinary Time—for those days when there is no special feast—is Green. May we celebrate this season with love and commitment. Amen! Fr Alex

Theme: The Prayer of the Humble. Last Sunday the readings told us to pray continually and persistently! This Sunday the readings tell us that the Lord listens to the prayer of the humble, but rejects the prayer of the proud! The Episcopal Ordination of Bishop-elect Canon Peter Collins will take place at the Cathedral in Norwich on 14th December at 11.30am. Bishop Alan will continue as Apostolic Administrator until Bishop-elect Peter has been ordained as bishop and installed. Our blessings to Bishop-elect Peter and our thanks and blessings to Apostolic Administrator Alan for his devotion, care and work in our diocese.

Exhibition of Prisoners Artwork – Fr. Paulinus, the chaplain of HMP Norwich has put together an exhibition of artwork completed by Prisoners from HMP Norwich. The artwork will be on display in the community room during the mornings of Tuesday 23rd and Wednesday 24th October.

This year, **World Mission Sunday** falls on **Sunday, 23 October**. On this day the whole Church unites in prayer for its missionary activity, and in collecting funds to support Catholic communities across the world living in situations of poverty and privation.

The theme chosen by the Holy Father is: 'You shall be my witnesses' (Acts 1:8). In his message for World Mission Sunday, Pope Francis says: *'The essence of mission is to bear witness to Christ, that is, to his life, passion, death and resurrection for the love of the father and of humanity.'*

All donations go to the Universal Solidarity Fund in order to meet the material needs of Catholic communities too young, too small or too poor to support themselves. Donations help them to live out the mission entrusted to them by the Lord.
